

# Artifacts from the Past

Activity - Look at/discuss items from the past

Supplies:

Multiple historic artifacts divided onto trays.

Themes can include: school, kitchen, laundry, tools, gardening, toys & games. *Method:* 

Circulate trays of artifacts around to between tables. Children must guess what they are for. When all have made a prediction, older persons explain what the artifact is and how/when it was used.

## Suggestions:

Museums are a good source to borrow artifacts from.

Remind children that older items need to be handled with care.

Extension: find modern equivalent and see if children can match items (for example typewriter and computer.)

### Intentions:

Learn about the past by provoking memory and rich conversations.

### Curriculum Links:

Social Studies, Oral Language, Prediction

Cooks choice.

Who has seen these items before?
