

Feed the Birds

Activity - Winter Bird Feeders

Supplies:

plastic table covers

plastic needles, string and yarn

popped popcorn, fresh cranberries

dried oranges

ribbon, pipe cleaners

pinecones, lard, bird seed

Cut Christmas tree and stand, if no

suitable live tree on grounds

Method:

string popcorn and cranberries

hang dried oranges

roll pinecones in lard and birdseed and

hang

Suggestions:

Cover the tables in plastic as lard is messy.

Create mathematical patterns with popcorn and cranberries.

Modify words for songs to fit bird trees.

Intentions:

Decorate outdoor tree(s) with bird feeders
